



GOLF ETIQUETTE



General

Show up early to your tee time.

Dress appropriately.

Obey the official and local golf rules.

Obey all cart path signage.

At the end of round, shake hands with your fellow players.

Consideration for Other Players

Do not disturb other players by moving, talking, or making unnecessary noise, including talking on your phone.

Do not hit until the group ahead of you is out of range – always yell “fore” if a shot goes in the direction of other players.

Do not stand close to or directly behind a ball or a hole when a player is about to play their shot; make sure your shadow isn't in someone's line of sight.

On the putting green, do not stand on or walk on another player's line.

Mark your ball on the green if it is on or close to someone's line.

Players should remain on or close to the green until all players have holed out.

Don't park in front of the green while putting – pull around to the side or the back so that group behind you can hit.

Pace of Play

Be ready to play when it's your turn – the player the furthest from the hole generally plays first but play “ready golf” when appropriate.

Keep up with the group ahead of you.

Do not spend an excessive amount of time looking for a ball – no more than 2 mins.

After finishing a hole, immediately move off the green and on to the next tee box.

Let quicker group play through.

Care of the Course

Replace all divots or fill with sand and repair ball marks on putting green.

Rake sand traps/bunkers.

Do not stand too close to the edge of a hole.

Do not use the head of your club to remove the ball from the hole.
